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# Identification

# Driver's License Reinstatement

If you want to make sure that you have a valid Pennsylvania Driver's License or you want more information about a suspension, call the **Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT).** 

If you need your license reinstated and you are eligible, you can do this in person at the local driver's license center. Call ahead to ensure you bring the correct documents. If your license was suspended because you did not pay child support, you must contact **Berks County's Domestic Relations Section.** 

There is usually a fee to reinstate your license. There is no agency in Berks County that can pay the reinstatement fee.

<u>All fees must be paid by check or money order.</u> Cash and credit cards will not be accepted.

# **Driver's License Renewal or Replacement**

If you have an expired PA Driver's License, you may renew it in person at the local driver's license center.

If you are replacing a PA Driver's License because it was lost or stolen, you can also apply in person at the local driver's license center. It can be replaced through the PennDOT website, must know ID/DL#, last four of SS#

# State-Issued Photo ID

If you have a PA State ID issued within the past 10 years, you can apply in person at the driver's license center. No additional documentation is needed. You may also apply online and have a replacement mailed to you in 15 days. If you have never had a PA State ID, you will need to provide your original birth certificate, Social Security Card, and documentation of residency (mail or bill with your name and current address) to the driver's license center.

# **Social Security Card**

Individuals can apply for a social security card by completing the application in its entirety and taking it to the Social Security Office along with their State-Issued Photo ID or Driver's License.

If you do not have a State-Issued Photo ID, the social security office will accept School Records, Medical Records, Employee ID card, Passport, Military Record, School ID Card, Marriage or Divorce Record, Adoption Record, Health Insurance Card (not a Medicare Card) or Life Insurance Policy as proof of your identity.

You can create an online account with Social Security Administration and receive a replacement card. (Not applicable if your state ID is out of AL, NH, OK, WV, Guam, US Virgin Islands, PR, American Samoa, and Northern Mariana Islands)

# **Birth Certificate**

Individuals can apply for a birth certificate by completing the application for the state in which they were born and mailing it to the address listed on the application, along with a copy of their State-Issued Photo ID. There is a fee that varies state by state. Certain states may require additional documentation; refer to your state's instructions.

If you do not have a valid State-Issued Photo ID, a family member can apply for it on your behalf. The family member must have a valid photo ID and can be a grandparent, parent, or child over the age of 18. Applicants must complete and mail the application with a copy of their ID.

For Pennsylvania, the fee for a Birth Certificate is \$20. PA birth certificate applications are available online at:

You can use cash (exact change) or a BARTA Pass or Ten Trip Ticket.

- Passes are sold for One Day, 31 Days or 10 Trips
- The current Standard Fare (as of January 2021) is \$1.80, no charge to transfer or ride between different route Zones if used within 2 hours. A One Day Pass is \$4.00 when purchased on the bus and \$3.70 if purchased ahead of time.
- Passes can be purchased at the BARTA Transportation Center at 1700 N. 11<sup>th</sup> Street in Reading and other locations. Some passes can be purchased on the bus when you board.

Riders age **65+** can apply for the **"Senior Citizen Free Ride Program"**- riders will need a PA Senior Citizen Transit ID Card issued by any PA Transit Authority. An application can be found on the BARTA bus website.

## **Register to Vote**

Individuals may register to vote if they have been citizens of the United States for at least one month and residents of their Pennsylvania election districts for at least 30 days before the next election. Individuals who have been convicted of a felony and will be <u>released before the next election</u> are eligible to register to vote. Most libraries and post offices have voting materials.

#### Who Is Eligible to Register and Vote

Individuals awaiting trial on either felony or misdemeanor charges (pretrial detainees); individuals confined and <u>convicted on misdemeanor charges only</u>; individuals on probation or parole (even those in a halfway house); and individuals under house arrest, regardless of conviction status.

#### Who May Not Register or Vote

Individuals confined under a felony charge (even if also charged with one or more misdemeanor); individuals in a halfway house or correctional facility on <u>pre-release status for a felony</u>; and individuals who have been convicted of violating the Pennsylvania election code within the last four years.

#### How to Register

Individuals may apply to vote by mail or online. Obtain a mail application by contacting your local county board of elections, or request an application over the phone by calling the Department of State at 1-887-868-37772. Alternatively, apply online by navigating the Department of State's website: www.VotesPA.com

#### How to Vote

You may vote in person at your assigned election district; the location should be included on your voter identification card, which you will have received after registering. Alternatively, apply for an absentee ballot if you are unable to attend your polling place on Election Day. Contact your county board of elections to obtain an absentee ballot. Those confined to a penal institution, under house arrest, or in a halfway house may only vote via absentee ballot.
